Request for Proposals

The Wyoming Department of Education invites you to submit a proposal for the Roadmap to STEM Conference. The goal of this conference is to provide practical information to educators, administrators, curriculum coordinators and counselors at the secondary and postsecondary levels about STEM program implementation (including activities, hands-on application, resources, funding opportunities, etc.).

We would like this information to be presented in a way that encourages pedagogical content knowledge, emphasizing the delivery of content knowledge in forms that are meaningful to students. In other words, the emphasis should not just be on *what* is implemented and taught, but *how* it can be implemented and taught effectively and engagingly. STEM should be addressed as comprehensively as possible, including all elements rather than just one (e.g. addressing Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics, rather than Mathematics alone), though there can be emphasis in one area. It will also be important to provide educators and administrators the tools needed to sustain STEM programs long-term.

Proposals will be accepted for the following sessions:

- 60-Minute Break-Out Workshop on Wednesday, August 6th (10:30 11:30 a.m.)
- 50-Minute Breakout Session on Thursday, August 7th (8:30 9:45 a.m. OR 10:00 11:15 a.m.)
- Half-Day STEM Experience on Friday, August 8th (8:00 a.m. 12:00 p.m.)
 - This session will allow participants to *experience* STEM activities, projects, research, curriculum and industry, especially including hands-on participation.

Please keep in mind that we prefer that the session encourage active learning and demonstrate innovative thinking.
