TRAINING PLANS

WIDA will be offering a number of informational webinars throughout fall 2015, as well as releasing training materials for Test Coordinators and Test Administrators preparing for the operational test.

Over this summer, WIDA will be revising the Training Course so that Test Coordinators and Test Administrators are able to go to just one place for the checklists, web-based modules, and Test Administration Manuals that will help them prepare for ACCESS for ELLs 2.0. These materials will require a WIDA login, as is currently the case for the ACCESS for ELLs Training Course.

Also this summer, WIDA and operational test partner Data Recognition Corporation will be adapting and enhancing the portal that will become the new WIDA Assessment Management System (WIDA-AMS). Technology Coordinators will use WIDA-AMS to access their checklist, all web-based modules, and system downloads for the online test. As a result, Technology Coordinators will not be required to log into the WIDA website.

FIELD TEST UPDATES

Nearly 20,000 English Language Learners participated in this year's field test, which ended April 10th. In addition to the end-of-test survey students completed, WIDA is collecting feedback from district participants and WIDA member state representatives. This feedback will be used to adapt training materials and procedures for the operational test, so please let us know if you have suggestions.

TECHNOLOGY CORNER

Please keep in mind that a headset with microphone is required to administer the online ACCESS for ELLs 2.0 Speaking test. As noted in the <u>Headset Specifications document</u>, WIDA recommends group administering the Speaking test to no more than 5-7 students in one room. Thus, individual Test Administrators will only need that number of headsets in order to test one group of students at a time.

QUESTION OF THE MONTH

What are the benefits of online testing?

Key benefits of the online test include:

- More dynamic and interactive test for students
- The ability to test multiple grades and proficiency levels at the same time
- Group administration of the Speaking test
- Test Administrator will not need to score Speaking (or any of the other three domains)
