JASON FLATT ACT UPDATE

The following is a newly revised list of approved Suicide Prevention Education programs under the Jason Flatt Act. These programs have been compiled under W.S. 21-2-202 (a)(xxxv), W.S. 21-3-110 (a)(xxxiii), and the recommendations of the State Superintendent of Public Instruction's appointed Suicide Prevention Review Team. The Jason Flatt Act was adopted in Wyoming during the 2014 legislative session, and it requires suicide prevention education for teachers and administrators.

The Jason Flatt Act requires teachers to receive a minimum of eight hours of training over a four-year period. Schools may supplement this training with a variety of other activities and programs that are not included in the above list.
