NATIONAL STANDARDS BOARD ANNOUNCES 72 NEW WYOMING BOARD CERTIFIED TEACHERS

CHEYENNE - The Wyoming Department of Education, the John P. Ellbogen Foundation and the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards announced today that 72 teachers in Wyoming achieved National Board Certification this year. Over the past three years, Wyoming has had the second-fastest growth in the nation in its number of accomplished teachers, following Hawaii, and now has a total of 497 National Board Certified Teachers (NBCTs).

National Board Certification is available in 25 certificate areas from Pre-K-12th grades. National Board Standards are written for teachers, by teachers. To date, more than 106,000 teachers in all 50 states and around the world have achieved this highest mark of accomplishment in the profession through a rigorous, performance-based, peer-review process.

"Achieving National Board Certification is not only a great personal achievement, it is a strong statement about a teacher's commitment to the profession and to students and their learning," said Ronald Thorpe, president and CEO of the National Board. "Today, only a small fraction of America's teachers are Board certified, but to improve the global competitiveness of our students, we must ensure that every novice teacher in is on a trajectory towards accomplished practice."

Rich Crandall, director of the Wyoming Department of Education said of Wyoming's newest NBCTs, "Their achievement is not only a testament to their hard work, determination and impact on their students' learning, it is a reflection of the state's strong commitment to



supporting all teachers in their pursuit of National Board Certification."

Wyoming state legislation provides Wyoming teachers who achieve National Board Certification with a \$4,000 stipend. In addition, the Ellbogen Foundation has launched a statewide initiative in support of boosting the number of NBCTs in Wyoming schools, in partnership with the Wyoming Department of Education, the State Standards Board, the University of Wyoming and the Wyoming Education Association. The Ellbogen Meritorious Schools Initiative supports and encourages schools to certify up to 20 percent of their staff and provides each school with a financial award when this goal is achieved.

"To truly transform the culture within schools, we need to get to a point where there is a critical mass of Board-certified teachers working together to elevate teaching and advance student learning," said Foundation President and Chair Mary Ellbogen Garland. "And it is through the work of accomplished teachers in every community, in every school, that would create a ripple effect of quality student-based teaching to reach and positively impact every student in Wyoming."

Mauro Diaz, a Board-certified science teacher at Dean Morgan Middle School in Casper, currently serving as a Teacher Ambassador Fellow by the U.S. Department of Education, said, "National Board Certification gave me the opportunity, confidence and influence to help shape my profession on a higher level. It opened doors and opportunities I would have never thought possible."

After meeting U.S. Education Secretary Arne Duncan at the White House in 2011, Diaz organized the first Wyoming Summit on Education, bringing together 45 NBCTs from across the state. The group eventually published a 10-point plan to recruit, retain and develop effective teachers in Wyoming, which they later presented to stakeholders and policy makers.

Research has shown that NBCTs have a significant impact on student achievement and that their students outperform their peers in other classrooms. Most recently, a 2012 study by Harvard University's Strategic Data Project found that students of NBCTs in the Los Angeles Unified School District made learning gains equivalent to an additional two months of instruction in math and one month in English Language Arts.
