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## **2012 Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) Results**

Cheyenne – The purpose of this press release is to provide clarity to the September 17, 2012 press release (<http://edu.wyoming.gov/sf-docs/press-releases/2012---sep-17---ayp-press-release.pdf?sfvrsn=2>) concerning Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP). All Wyoming school districts have reviewed their AYP related data; one district's AYP determinations remain under review per its request.

State-level AYP results for the 2011-2012 school year are as follows:

### **2011-12 School Year\***

A total of 34 out of 48 school districts across Wyoming met AYP targets for the 2011-12 school year.

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For comparison purposes, results for the previous school year are as follows:

**2010-11 School Year**

| <b>Number Of Schools That Did Not Meet AYP Targets for the 2010-11 School Year (N = 101)</b> | <b>Consecutive Year(s) of Not Achieving AYP</b> | <b>Percent of All Wyoming Schools</b> |

There are two fundamental differences between the 2011-2012 and 2010-2011 school results, specifically they are:

1. Annual Measureable Objectives (AMOs), targets that schools and districts must meet in AYP, were significantly increased for elementary schools and decreased for high schools. This was a result of the Wyoming Legislature's actions that removed writing from the 2011-2012 PAWS testing.
2. Safe Harbor, another way schools can make AYP, was not available in the 2010-2011 school year because it required two consecutive years of data (Note: 2009-2010 data was not valid). Many schools in the 2011-2012 school year benefited from the Safe Harbor provisions of AYP.
