Every high school, middle, school, community college, and court-ordered residential placement in the state will be receiving an invitation soon to have a career guidance staff member trained as a certified Career Development Facilitator (CDF) starting this Spring. This is in response to the Carl D. Perkins CTE Improvement Act of 2006 calling for "improvement of career guidance and academic counseling programs that assist students in making informed academic and career and technical education decisions" (Part B, Sec. 124, (c), 1).

Why CDF? The National Career Development Association (NCDA) is the first, longest running (founded in 1913), and preeminent career development association in the world. NCDA developed a best practice in Career Development Facilitator training to provide individuals with relevant skills and knowledge to assist others in planning careers and obtaining meaningful work. NCDA has prepared over 18,000 CDFs for this international certification. The only prerequisite is a high school degree. This training will seed the state with competent and effec-

tive career guidance professionals. Good career guidance can help reduce high school drop-out and increase graduation rates in post-secondary education.
