Specifics of reporting to parents & school (format, frequency, method of communication)	Parents receive progress reports at a minimum on a weekly basis. Parents are involved initially in the determination of achievement goals for the student’s Learning/Improvement Plan. As much as possible tutor communicates with parents in person, or by phone if parents do not pick their child up from tutoring. Tutors give progress reports to students’ teachers on a weekly basis. In addition, tutors contact teachers initially to help determine appropriate learning goals for the student.
