WYOMING HIGH-NEED SCHOOL DISTRICTS 2013-2014 Mathematics and Science Partnership Grant Application

- 1) Wyoming defines a high need school district as:
One in which 40% or more of the children served by the district qualify for free or reduced lunch per the October 1, 2012 District Snapshot.

OR

- 2) A **district** that did not make Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in mathematics in 2013, or the district has **one or more schools** that did not make AYP in mathematics for **any or all of the subgroups**. OR

- 3) A district in which not more than 50% of tested students in grades 4, 8 and 11 scored Proficient/Advanced on the 2013 PAWS Science test. To access this information, go to <https://fusion.edu.wyoming.gov> . Click on the “Data Reporting” tab, and then “Assessment”.
