WYOMING HIGH-NEED SCHOOL DISTRICTS 2014-2015 Mathematics and Science Partnership Grant Application

- 1) Wyoming defines a high need school district as:
One in which 40% or more of the children served by the district qualify for free or reduced lunch per the October 1, 2013 District Snapshot. To access this information go to edu.wyoming.gov. Click on Data and Accountability, and then “Statistical Report Series #2.

OR

- 2) A **district** that did not make Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in mathematics in 2014, or the district has **one or more schools** that did not make AYP in mathematics for **any or all of the subgroups**. To access AYP information, go to <http://fusion.edu.wyoming.gov>. Click on the “Data Reporting” tab, “Accountability”, and then “AYP Results”.

OR

- 3) A district in which not more than 50% of tested students in grades 4, 8 and 11 scored Proficient/Advanced on the 2014 PAWS/ACT Science test. To access this information, go to <https://fusion.edu.wyoming.gov> . Click on the “Data Reporting” tab, and then “Assessment”.
