SCHOOL DISTRICT ACCREDITATION

Kay Post and Dianne Frazer presented the school districts with changed accreditation status. Each district was given the opportunity to speak for 3-5 minutes regarding their updated accreditation status and their response to it.

The Board was given a chart that outlined the districts, their status, and the reason for their current status; the North Central Association (NCA) accreditation visit reports; an accreditation checklist for each district and what their scores were from NCA according to the rubric that NCA uses and a report on misassignment status. NCA uses a 5-year cycle for visiting schools for accreditation. All recommendations from NCA were reviewed by the Accreditation Task Force at the WDE.

Districts assigned accreditation with follow up are assigned a coach and work directly with NCA on the issues that need to be improved, usually within a year. Districts assigned accreditation with deficiencies also have a coach as well as an oversight team, usually in a specific area, to help these schools with major systemic problems.

36 of the 48 school districts in the state of Wyoming are being recommended for full accreditation.
