Funds through the Trust are available for one-year grants to any public school district. Districts may apply individually, or in conjunction with other districts or educational institutions. A total of about \$250,000.00 is available for this grant. An estimated five to seven grants will be awarded.

Awarded districts will be notified by May 31, 2019. Funds will be distributed to the awarded districts by July 31, 2019 and are available for district use until June 30, 2020. W.S. 21-22-107 (c) states that at least one qualifying grant must be awarded if possible in each of the following classifications based on average daily membership (ADM):

Classification I Less than 500 ADM

Classification II 500 but less than 1,000 ADM
Classification III 1,000 but less than 2,000 ADM

Classification IV 2,000 or greater ADM

Grant proposals must be received by April 26, 2019.
