# WYOMING'S 2ND STATE SONG "WYOMING WHERE I BELONG"

Since 1955, "Wyoming," words by Charles E. Winter and music by George E. Knapp, has been the official state song of Wyoming. House Enrolled Act 52, of the 2018 Wyoming legislative session, established a second Wyoming state song "Wyoming, Where I Belong" by Annie and Amy Smith.

District use of these songs aligns to music standards in the <u>Fine</u> & <u>Performing Arts Standards</u> and <u>Social Studies Content and</u> <u>Performance Standards</u> from kindergarten through high school:

**FPA4.3.M.2:** Students listen to a varied repertoire of music and explore the historical and cultural significance.

**FPA8.3.M.2:** Students listen to a varied repertoire of music and explain the characteristics that cause a work to be considered historically or culturally significant.

**FPA11.3.M.2:** Students listen to a varied repertoire of music, emphasizing American music, and analyze the characteristics that cause a work to be considered historically or culturally significant.
