- SUBJECT: 2021 Lexile® and Quantile® Summer Learning Opportunities

SUMMER LEARNING FOR STUDENTS IN READING AND MATH

The 2021 Quantile[®] Summer Math Challenge (SMC) uses a student's mathematics score, reported as a Quantile[®] measure, to produce activities tailored to the student's mathematical ability. It is a free, six-week program where students in grades 1-8 can complete fun daily interactive activities and download worksheets chosen specifically for the student's grade and ability level. Sign In or Register at the top right corner of the SMC page. Once registered and signed in, students can be enrolled by clicking on the Add/Edit Student button.

The 2021 Summer Math Challenge will begin on Monday, June 21, 2021.

The SMC has been added to the Lexile[®] & Quantile[®] Hub, providing a convenient place for students to do activities and track their progress. Parents can monitor activities completed and download a certificate of completion from the Hub.

Find a Book, Wyoming enables K-12 students, educators, and parents to use a student's reading score, reported as a Lexile measure, to provide a corresponding list of texts that fall within the student's reading ability. Find a Book, Wyoming resources also enable students, parents, and educators to check the availability of books at their local library, and to submit a pledge to read.

Lexile[®] and Quantile[®] measures are reported on the Wyoming Test of Proficiency and Progress (WY-TOPP) Individual Student Reports (ISRs) that schools share with parents. Both tools have features which allow students, parents, and educators to estimate a Lexile[®] or Quantile[®] measure.

Note: The Lexile® and Quantile® Hub, which houses the SMC, works best on a laptop or desktop computer, using the Google Chrome or Firefox browser. Internet Explorer is not compatible with the SMC/Hub, and tablets and smartphones with their small screen size often do not accommodate the use of the tools well.
