REVISED MEDICAID ELIGIBILITY DATA REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Wyoming statute 21-13-321(j) requires school districts to report the Medicaid eligibility status of students who receive special education services beginning in the 2022-23 school year.

The Wyoming Department of Education (WDE) has worked with the student information system providers to add a new option to the Medicaid Eligibility field in the WDE684 special education file. Districts that are enrolled in the School Based Services (SBS) Medicaid program must report either Y (Yes) or N (No) for each IDEA student. Districts not participating in the SBS program will report X for each IDEA student. The WDE will work with non-participating districts to report the aggregate number of Medicaid eligible students to satisfy the reporting requirement under W.S. 21–13–321(j).

On July 19, 2022, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) approved the Wyoming State Plan Amendment, which enables LEAs to begin billing for services listed in the Wyoming Medicaid State Plan. The School-Based Services state plan amendment allows LEA providers to bill for a variety of services provided to Medicaid-eligible Students.
