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General Overview

- The purpose of Title I, Part D, Subpart 2 is to support programs which help students to graduate from high school.

General Overview (cont.)

- **Primary Student Populations**
 - Children adjudicated within the juvenile justice system
 - Migrant children
 - Immigrant children
 - Pregnant and Parenting Youth
 - ELL Students
 - Children at Risk of School Failure
 - Children who have dropped out of school

General Overview (cont.)

- **Popular Allowable Uses of Funds**
 - Providing teachers and materials to juvenile correctional facilities
 - Providing credit recovery opportunities
 - Transition programs for middle school students
 - Truancy programs

Updates

- **2009 USED Monitoring**
 - 1 Finding – inadequate monitoring
 - Particularly tied to data collections
 - LEAs must document their review of the WDE-568 for future monitoring
 - Added to narrative in the Consolidated Grant application

Updates

- **Consolidated Grant**

- Due September 30, 2010

- “Substantially Approvable”

- Periodic Expenditure Reports must be submitted for all GMS grants beginning September 2010

Updates

- **Data Collection**

- WDE – 568 due September 1, 2010
- WDE – 549 due November 23, 2010
 - Count students between October 1 – October 30
 - Duplicated student count
 - If you have questions about which facilities to count, please call

Updates

- **Funding**

- Funding is based on annual counts for neglected and delinquent students.
- Districts submit separate counts for neglected and delinquent students.
 - Neglected student counts effect a district's Title I, Part A allocation
 - Delinquent student counts effect a district's Title I, Part D allocation
- Wyoming districts that have a high concentration of delinquent youth are funded.
- There is no “hold harmless provision” in Title I, Part D


