

# APPENDIX A

## WYOMING HIGH-NEED SCHOOL DISTRICTS

Wyoming defines a high need school district as:

- 1) One in which 40% or more of the children served by the district qualify for free or reduced lunch per the October 1, 2009 District Snapshot data reported online at [http://www.k12.wy.us/statistics/stat2/2009\\_enrollment\\_with\\_free\\_reduced.pdf](http://www.k12.wy.us/statistics/stat2/2009_enrollment_with_free_reduced.pdf)

**OR**

- 2) A **district** that did not make Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in mathematics in 2009, or the district has **one or more schools** that did not make AYP in mathematics for **any or all of the subgroups**. To access AYP information, go to <http://www.k12.wy.us/eqa/ayp.asp>

**OR**

- 3) A district in which not more than 50% of tested students in grades 4, 8 and 11 scored Proficient/Advanced on the 2009 PAWS Science test.
