

Milk Shortage Disallowance Policy

PURPOSE:

To set forth the Wyoming policy regarding the shortage of purchased milk at a CACFP center during the review process. If any part of this policy conflicts with the regulations or memoranda issued by the USDA, the federal regulations and memoranda shall take precedence.

SCOPE:

This relates to participating CACFP centers and Sponsors of CACFP affiliated and unaffiliated centers of a Sponsoring Organization.

DESCRIPTION:

If it is a repeat finding from the previous review and there is a shortage of 10 gallons and above - matching receipts to the meals claimed that require milk as a component.

- The Wyoming Department of Education will take away the percentage of meals that require milk to be reimbursable directly correlated to the percentage of gallons of milk that were short for the three months of milk review.

If it is not a repeat finding and there is a shortage of 10 gallons and above-matching receipts to the meals claimed that require milk as a component.

- The Wyoming Department of Education will take away the percentage of meals that require milk to be reimbursable directly correlated to the percentage of gallons of milk that were short for the month of review only
