Attendance will be carefully monitored; but the meaning of attendance will change. Participation and engagement rather than physical presence will be the best indicator of students taking part regularly in the remote learning environment.

A student will be considered participating and engaged when:

- Attending Zoom/Google Hangout sessions
 - Participating in threaded discussions
 - Submitting assignments
 - Taking an assessment
 - Uploading a video
 - Taking part in 1:1 communication
 - Interacting in any other teacher-approved manner
- Students may be required to do some synchronous and one-on-one sessions. Multiple opportunities for students to engage with the learning will be provided. The districts do not assume that each student can follow the same schedule in his/her home learning environment.



Follow up for students who don't participate or engage:

Student Support Team Intervention:

Students (or parent if the student can't be reached) who are not participating or engaged for one day will be contacted by a member of the student support team. Both the student and a parent will be contacted by a member of the student support team if not participating or engaged for a second day.



Support Staff Intervention:

Students who are not participating or engaged for three consecutive days will be referred to the school counselor(s) or other school support staff in addition to continued contacts by the members of the student support team. Support staff will offer possible solutions for challenges encountered by the student.

Administrative Intervention:

If a student is not participating or engaged for five consecutive days, the student will be referred to administration who can then refer the student to the school resource officer or other designee for a home drive by or in-person home check. Any student not present or inactive for eight consecutive days will be referred for a welfare check from either the city police department or the sheriff's office if the student lives outside city limits.
