

Basic Emergency Care (BEC)



Basic Emergency Care (BEC) prepares students to pursue a postsecondary Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)/Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) course of study.

- Instructors are licensed at the EMT level or higher. Districts may request approval from the Office of Emergency Medical Services
- No clinical component is required
- Students must be 16 years of age or older
- Certification is good for two (2) years
- Often this secondary course of study is articulated with community colleges for HLED 1221 credit and/or HLTK 1670 credit
