Introduction

- As authorized under Title IV, Part B of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), the specific purposes of the 21st CCLC program are:
- To provide opportunities for academic support and enrichment to help students, particularly those who attend low-performing schools, to meet the challenging State academic standards.
- To offer students a broad array of additional services, programs, and activities such as youth development activities, fine arts, financial literacy, service learning, nutrition and wellness, mathematics, science, career and technical education programs, internships/apprenticeships designed to reinforce and complement the regular academic programs.
- To offer families of students served by community learning centers opportunities for active and meaningful engagement in their children's education, including opportunities for literacy and related educational development.


Quick Facts

- 20 Subgrantees with 33 grants (cohorts 12-15) in 19 of 23 counties.
- 64 centers (preK-high school).
- 5600+ students served.
- 37% eligible for free or reduced lunch-17% are students with disabilities.
- 66% are K-5th grade
- 28% attended more than 90 hours of programming during summer and fall 2022.


- Applicants and subgrantees intentionally design programs aligned to performance goals and objectives to meet *local needs* and personalized learning needs of children and youth.














