2025 Information

Teacher of the Year Program

The Teacher of the Year (TOY) Program recognizes the contributions of a certified classroom teacher in pre-kindergarten through grade twelve. There are three awards for which a teacher may be eligible:

- District Teacher of the Year (DTOY)
- Wyoming Teacher of the Year (WTOY)
- National Teacher of the Year (NTOY)

Each DTOY awardee is eligible to be considered for the WTOY award. Candidates wishing to be considered for both the DTOY and WTOY awards must complete this application in its entirety.

IMPORTANT: The DTOY candidate must complete the electronic application and submit it to the Wyoming Department of Education (WDE) no later than Friday, June 28, 2024. Upon receipt of this application, the DTOY will be considered for the WTOY.

DTOY Selection Process

Each school district determines its own nomination and review process. Teachers can be nominated from each school in the district, or districts may choose to nominate teachers from one small, one medium, and one large school within the district. The method for selecting candidates is determined by the district, and teachers can be nominated by parents, students, colleagues, principals, and so on. The DTOY review committee may consist of building principals, district superintendents, colleagues, student organizations, building staff/faculty, the general public, and local legislators (relatives of the DTOY candidates should be excluded from the review process). Districts may only submit one name as their DTOY. The DTOY must be an active teacher through December 2025.

DTOY applicants must submit their own application to the WDE no later than Friday, June 28, 2024. Only the application for the DTOY awardee should be submitted to the WDE. Only one (1) application per district will be accepted.

The DTOY awardees from each district will be considered for the WTOY award. Additionally, the WTOY awardee will be considered for the NTOY award. The timeline and selection process for the WTOY and NTOY awards is detailed in this application information packet.

Duties & Responsibilities of the WTOY

The successful candidate who serves as the Wyoming Teacher of the Year must maintain his/her current employment position. If the WTOY is selected as the National Teacher of the Year, they will be released from classroom responsibilities during the year of national recognition.

Being named Wyoming Teacher of the Year comes with the significant responsibility of representing the entire teaching profession in Wyoming. The WTOY acts as:

- A liaison between the teaching community, Wyoming Legislature, WDE, districts, and communities.
- An education ambassador to businesses, parents, service organizations, and media.
- A resource on the state of the profession; to be available for workshops and conferences across the state.
- An education leader involved in teacher forums and education reform.

The WTOY is expected to attend both state and national events such as educational meetings, conferences, and workshops. Since the WTOY will be requested to attend many events and make presentations and speeches during the year, they must be poised, articulate, and have the energy to withstand a busy schedule.

The WTOY automatically becomes the nominee for the **NTOY Program**, which is a project of the **Council of** Chief State School Officers.

Selection Criteria for WTOY

A candidate for WTOY is a **DTOY** who teaches pre-kindergarten through grade twelve, who is planning to continue in an active teaching status.

The candidate for WTOY has the respect and admiration of their colleagues and:

- 1. is an expert in their field who advances growth for students of all backgrounds and abilities;
- 2. builds collaborative relationships with colleagues, students, and families to create a school culture of equity and success;
- deliberately connects the classroom to the community to impact student growth and learning;
- 4. demonstrates leadership and innovation in and outside of the classroom walls that embodies lifelong learning, and
- 5. expresses themselves in an engaging and clear way, conveying the lived classroom experience to a variety of audiences.

Contents of a Complete Application

Districts may submit one DTOY to be considered for the WTOY award. The DTOY must submit the complete **electronic application** to the WDE by the deadline.

The following items must be submitted electronically* to the WDE by the deadline:

Incomplete application packets and late submissions will NOT be considered for the WTOY or NTOY award. Please note sections that go over the maximum word/page requirement may lose points.

Additional information will be requested from the WTOY for the submission of the NTOY application. The WDE TOY Coordinator will reach out for this information once the WTOY is selected.

Level Up

All DTOYs and their principal are eligible to be a part of the **Level Up Leadership Program**. The Level Up Leadership Program seeks to elevate Wyoming's education professionals by providing leadership development to an annual cohort of Wyoming's leading educators. Upon completion of this program, these educators will be better prepared to tackle the daily challenges of providing an exceptional education to Wyoming students as well as become leaders in their community.

This program will help education leaders build relationships that cross district lines, increase the knowledge of what is going on in other parts of the state, and help these leaders develop strategies to continue to engage with their community.

The Level Up Leadership Cohort is made up of the District Teachers of the Year (DTOY) and their principals, Milken Educator Award winners, and Presidential Award for Excellence in Math and Science Teaching (PAEMST) recipients and finalists.

WTOY Selection Process

All DTOY applications received by the deadline will go to the WDE selection panel for review. The scoring of each application will be based on this rubric. The selection panel will individually score each application. Each application will be **redacted** to remove the name, district, city, and school. Grade level and subject area will not be redacted as they give context to the answers. The top three applications will become finalists.

The three finalists will be scheduled for virtual interviews where the entire selection panel will ask questions about their teaching style and practices. The questions for this interview will **NOT** be given out ahead of time. In addition, the finalists will be asked to present a 5-7 minute keynote presentation conveying their platform message. The interviews and keynote will be scheduled at the same time, the finalist may select which they would like to do first.

The selection panel will score both the interviews and the keynote individually. Scores will be combined to select the Wyoming Teacher of the Year. If there is a tie, the selection panel will meet to discuss and select a recommendation. Final approval will be made by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction.

NTOY Application and Necessary Approvals

If selected as the WTOY, the following process and approvals are required for the NTOY application:

- 1. The WDE TOY Coordinator will reach out to the WTOY to complete the entire NTOY application which is more in-depth than what is in the WTOY application. The WTOY will write the application sections in word or Google docs and share it with the TOY Coordinator.
- 2. The WDE TOY Coordinator will move the word/Google Doc answers into the electronic NTOY application for the WTOY. Only the WDE Coordinator is given edit access to the NTOY application.
- 3. The WDE TOY Coordinator will send an acknowledgment and electronic signature request to:
 - a. the State Superintendent of Public Instruction
 - b. the WTOY District Superintendent
 - c. the WTOY Principal

- 4. The WDE TOY Coordinator will send a copy of the entire application packet for review by the WTOY awardee. The WTOY will need to thoroughly read and review the application. The WDE TOY Coordinator will make any revisions requested. Once the WTOY has approved the final application packet, the WTOY will electronically sign off.
- 5. Once all necessary approvals have been received, the WDE TOY Coordinator will submit the NTOY application.

Timeline and Selection Process

Timeline	Description
A deadline established by your local school district	Complete any needed paperwork required by your district to apply for the Wyoming Teacher of the Year. The DTOY must be approved by the District Superintendent.
June 28, 2024	Each DTOY submits the online application to the WDE. All applicants become candidates for the WTOY award.
July 1 through September 2024	WDE Team moves through its selection process for WTOY.
No later than September 1, 2024	Each participating district publicly announces its DTOY awardee. The local school district may choose to announce its DTOY any time before this date but no later than this date.
	Please note: a DTOY that becomes a finalist for WTOY will be notified sometime between July and August.
September 2024	2025 WTOY is announced by the WDE at the Wyoming Education Summit. The date of the conference is not yet set.
October 31, 2024	Application for the National Teacher of the Year (NTOY) award is due. This is submitted by the WDE on behalf of the WTOY.
December 2024	The National Selection Committee moves through its selection process for NTOY and selects the top four finalists.
December 2024	Four NTOY finalists, their state superintendent, and state teams of the four states selected will be notified by the Council of Chief State School Officers (CCSSO).
February 2025	The four NTOY finalists will be brought to Washington, D.C., where they will meet with the Selection Committee in a variety of situations, including individual interviews.
April/May 2025	The 2025 National Teacher of the Year will be announced and honored in Washington, DC.

- 2. Describe specific ways in which you deliberately connect your students with the community. Show how these community connections dissolve classroom walls and are used to impact student learning and success. (maximum 750 words)
- 3. Describe a time when you grew as a teacher leader and life-long learner as a result of being an advocate in your school, state, or beyond. Describe your advocacy, how it helped you grow and how it impacted students. (maximum 750 words)
- 4. As the 2024 Wyoming Teacher of the Year, you serve as a spokesperson and representative for all teachers and students. What is your message? What will you communicate to your profession and to the public? (maximum 750 words)
